Proposed Enlargement and Increase in the Planned Admission Number of Eltham Church of England Primary School - A Voluntary Aided School

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(3) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Eltham Church of England Primary School Governing Body intends to make a prescribed alteration to Eltham Church of England Primary School, Roper Street, Eltham, London, SE9 1TR, a Voluntary Aided School, with effect from 01 September 2016.

It is proposed to expand the school by the enlargement of the physical accommodation available to the school and increase the planned admission number for each year group from 45 places currently, to 60 places with effect from the 2016/17 school year intake. The admission number will be 60 for Reception Year in 2016/17, 60 for Year 1 in 2017/18, and so on until 2022/23 when the admission number for all year age groups will be 60.

The admission capacity of the school for children aged 4-11 is currently 315 places and the proposed admission capacity will be 420 places.

The current capacity of the school is 311 and the proposed capacity will be 420. The current number of pupils aged 4-11 registered at the school is 313. The current admission number for the school is 45 and the proposed admission number will be 60.

This Notice is an extract from the complete proposal and is published following consultations with interested parties in the areas served by the school in November and December 2013. Explanatory Note
